Presentation: Recent Marine Research in West Hawai'i - Dr. Jamison Gove.

Jamison Gove is a research scientist with NOAA's Pacific Islands Fisheries Science Center and leads the West Hawaii Integrated Ecosystem Assessment, a program dedicated to conducting collaborative, interdisciplinary research that in support of current and future resource management efforts in West Hawaii. Jamison has a P.h.D in Oceanography from the University of Hawaii at Manoa and specializes in Physical-Biological interactions in coral reef ecosystems.

Jamison Gove will be highlighting a series of recently published research articles all focused on advancing our understanding of the marine ecosystem in West Hawaii. Topics will include larval dispersal and recruitment, mapping human stressors, and evaluating the efficacy of alternative management stratagies for Puako's coral reef ecosystem.
